#1 NEW DELHI

Rishikesh Uttarakhand 243 km

ying in the foothills of Himalayas is the hub of temples, popular cafes, yoga ashrams and adventure sports - Rishikesh. Awaken the adventurer in you and indulge in sports like river rafting, trekking and giant wheeling. Get your adrenaline rush and make an experience of a lifetime by bungee jumping. If you seek spirituality, make your way to the yoga ashrams in the town. There is nothing like meditating in the open air as the sound of river lulls you. Make sure to stop by the Beatles Ashram in Rishikesh. Made famous by the eponymous English band, the ashram premises have a lush growth of green patched and beautiful artwork. You know this hippie town is worth it when The Beatles visited here often too!

Shimla Himachal Pradesh 360 km

himla is one of the most popular hill stations in northern India. Situated at an altitude of 2,205 meters, it used to be the summer capital of British India with a wellplanned architecture. The town is famous for pleasant walking experiences on hillsides surrounded by pine and oak forests. This capital city of Himachal Pradesh is famous for The Mall, ridge, and toy train. With colonial style buildings, the town has relics of ancient past that lend it a distinct look. Along a ridge of 12 km, its steep hillsides converge into all directions. The connecting road of the town, The Mall, bustles with locals and vacationers during morning and evening hours. South Shimla has a market cascading steeply down to the cart road. From mid-July to mid-September, it is covered with a snow blanket making it a muse for all nature lovers.











Nainital Uttarakhand 298 km

ocated around a deep, green volcanic lake, Nainital is Kumaon's largest town in the state of Uttarakhand. It crowds around a steep forested valley around the namesake lake Naini and was founded by the British who gave it a look and feel akin to the Cumbrian Lake District. There's a busy bazaar, a spider's web of walking tracks that lead to various viewpoints overlooking distant Himalayan peaks and plenty of hotels on the hillside around the lake. Basically, a great place for a traveller who wants to kick back and relax, eat well, ride horses and immerse himself in the beauty of nature. The best time to visit is roughly May to mid-July and October.





Mussoorie Uttarakhand 279 km

f you are in love with nature's romanticism and follow literature for that then the enchanting beauty of Mussoorie is your wonderland waiting for you.

Located at the height of almost 1900 meters from the sea levels, this landscape of nature has become a paradise for the tourists with a passage of time. This advantage point of nature has a history dating back to 19th century when the officers of ruling East India Company developed it as a holiday paradise in the hills. Located at the distance of 40 Kilometers from the state capital of Indian state of Uttranchal, Dehradun, Mussoorie also won this moniker of being the "queen of the hill stations." Attractions full of nature, religion and culture are at your disposal when you visit Mussoorie. This hill station also serves as a gateway to the glaciers of Yamunotri and Gangotri and we can consider it as an ideal place to spend summer vacations.







Auli Uttarakhand 394 km

ike many popular hill stations, Auli is situated in Uttarakhand. Located towards the north of the state and forming an extensive part of the Garhwal mountain range, Auli is located at 2800 meters or 9000 feet above sea level. It is home to the famous mountain ranges of Nanda Devi, Dunagiri, Beethartoli, Nilkanth, Hathi Parbat, Ghori Parbat, Mana Parvat and Kamat Kamet. Not only do you get to enjoy spellbinding views of the snow-draped mountains but you also get to go for numerous treks in the hills of Uttarakhand such as the Gorson Bugyal Trek. Densely covered with deodar and oak forests, Auli offers a very in your face kind of beauty. Its glittering slopes, lush greenery, clean environment is mesmerizing, a beauty you cannot turn away from.

Agra Uttar Pradesh 210 km

Located on the foothill of Western Ghats, this amazing hill town is situated at an elevation of 550 m above sea level, which offers spectacular lush green landscape, grassy hills, splendid lakes and quaint valleys.

From trekking and sightseeing to hiking, or simply enjoying the scenery – there is nothing that you can't do here. There are innumerable sighting options such as Rajmachi fort, Bhushi lake, Lohagad fort, Shingroba temple, Tiger point, Bedsa cave and much more. Even if you don't want to don the hat of an anxious traveller, at least visit the Kune waterfalls – it is a sight worth beholding.









Lonavala 88 km

onavala is the place to be during monsoons. With lots of waterfalls, lakes and hills around, Lonavala is frequented by all sorts of people, especially hikers and trekkers. Lonavala, being a part of the Sahyadri hills, offers an alluring and bewitching experience of nature's most gifted region. Surrounded by dense forests, waterfalls, dam alongside lakes, Lonavala is a must-visit if you admire nature and want a gateway to having a soulful weekend or a good trip. Also, visit Rajmachi on the way to Lonavala. The tourist destination has many attractions to its name, Bhaja caves, Bushi dam, Karla caves, Rajmachi fort, Ryewood lake, among others. Lonavala is famous for its production of the hard candy 'chikki', which is a sweet eatable thing made from different nuts mixed with jaggery. It is also a major stop on the railway line, which connects Mumbai and Pune.









Matheran 87 km

Atheran is situated at a height of 803m above sea level. Since 1907, a narrow gauge railway line connects Matheran to Neral in the plains. Motor vehicles are completely banned in Matheran, making it quite peaceful despite the thousands of visitors that come here. There are a number of lookout points that provide spectacular views of the surrounding hills and valley.

Matheran is a plateau with a reasonably dense forest cover. Being a hill station, it is pleasant almost throughout the year. In winter, the nights can get a bit chilly though. The best time to go to Matheran is post-monsoon. It is truly spectacular at this time of the year with lush greenery, waterfalls and the lake full with water.









place of enchanting natural beauty and mesmerizing sights, a union territory in west India can be reached any time of the year with its weather being pleasant for most of the time. Located near the vicinity of the Arabian Sea, cool sea breeze is always blowing through the city bringing any rise in the temperatures to normal levels. The beauty of Western Ghats multiplies when during the monsoons, forests get dense, waterfalls start to reverberate and the green becomes profuse. There are many things to do at Igatpuri. The bronze statue stands tall at 182 metres, grabbing the attention of the whole world as the "Tallest Statue in the World". The Statue of Unity is located in Gujarat on the river island of Sadhu Bet overlooking the Sardar Sarovar Dam from 3.2 km. Tent City Narmada, located beneath the shadow of Statue of Unity is another attraction to stay back in nature to explore the region and its unfathomable beauty. The Luxury Nature Resort offers tented stay accommodation surrounded by hills and valleys, greenery and pure air.

Nandi Hills 61 km

Andi Hills, also known as Nandidurg is an ancient hill fortress situated in the Chikkaballapur district near Bangalore. Nandi Hills is 4700 ft high above the sea level. People like to visit Nandi Hills mainly to view the beauty of the stunning sunrise above the clouds in the early morning.

To relieve stress from busy and hectic life, tourists prefer Nandi hills during weekends and holidays. Also, the morning breeze from the land that rejuvenates every cell of your body makes you happy. Apart from natural sceneries, it has several places to visit like Bhoga Nandeeshwara, a historic temple, Tipu's Summer Palace, Horse way, Nehru Nilaya, among many others.







amanagara is a quaint little town, only an hour's drive away from Bangalore. This place became iconic after the release of the Bollywood cult classic, Sholay. The rate at which fans flocked to the location following the release of the film, makes it impossible not to draw parallels with today's trend of enthusiastic Game of Thrones fans - the TV series that has become a global phenomenon - visiting in hoards countries like Croatia, Spain and Ireland where the show is known to have been shot. Known as Shamserabad during Tipu Sultan's era, renamed as Closepet during the British Raj, Ramanagara hills is now known as Silk City. It is one of the largest silk cocoon markets in all of Asia and the place where the finest Mysore silk is produced.

03 Kanakapura 63 km

n the state of Karnataka, a beautiful city is nestled amongst trees and rivers, which is excellent for a weekend getaway. This place is a hidden gem bountiful in greenery and waterfalls. Kanakapura is home to abundant flora and fauna. Some of the most common animals that can be easily spotted are wild boars, pigs, wild dogs and spotted deers. Wayanad 277 km

Get a hang of soothing Ayurvedic massage when in Wayanad and pull up your pants to attempt the most amazing treks.









Savandurga Hill 48 km

ituated 1226 metres above sea level, Savandurga Hills offers a promising weekend getaway from Bangalore. The hills are touted as one of Asia's largest single rock formations, which provide an unparalleled rock climbing experience to the adrenaline junkies. Apart from rock climbers and nature enthusiasts, the hills are also visited by pilgrims who come to visit the temples of Savandi Veerabhadreshwara Swamy and Narasimha Swamy. Trekkers frequent this place for the two main trekking trails going towards Savanadurga. One is the Karigudda and the other is the Biligudda trail. While Biligudda is easier to climb with a wellmarked out trail, Karigudda is tougher and less explored and involves the use of good rock climbing equipment.















Perched at an elevation of 3664 feet, Makalidurga Fort is situated around 60 km from Bangalore. Nestled between green hills, and graced with picturesque surroundings, the fort can be reached after a small trek. There is also a Lord Shiva temple in the vicinity of the fort that is visited by the local people frequently.

The place has become one of the most happening trekking destinations for adventurers.

It's perfect for a one-day getaway from Bangalore and gives you a chance to work on those glutes! Follow Google Maps blindly (for once!) and it will lead you right to the base of the hill where a railway track runs through. That's basically the starting point of your trek.



#4 KOLKATA

01 Tarakeswar 60 km

araknath Temple is the prime attraction of the Tarakeshwar village of Hooghly District. Taraknath Temple, dedicated to Lord Taraknath, was constructed in the year 1729 by Raja Bharamalla. The temple is built in central West Bengal style of temple architecture. It has four roofs above the sanctum sanctorum and extended galleries for the congregation of the devotees.

Taraknath Temple is considered among one of the 12 abodes of Lord Shiva or the jyotirlinga temples in India. This temple also has minor shrines dedicated to Goddess Kali and Lord Lakshmi-Narayan.





02 Gadiara 78 km

f your idea of relaxation is staring at the vast expanse of a river or admiring the hues of the setting sun as the wind sluices through your hair—then Gadiara is the place to be. A picturesque sleepy hamlet lying on the cusp of three main rivers of Bengal—Roopnarayan, Damodar and Hooghly, Gadiara is a popular getaway for the crowd of Kolkata. Opt for a country boat ride on the river and gorge on some exquisite delicacies like fresh water fish.







03 Henrys Island 126 km

enry's Island is a serene island near the village of Bakkhali, located in the district of South 24 Parganas. The captivating island is 126 kilometres away from the bustling city of Kolkata and is a quick getaway for the locals. The place is famous for its tranquillity, its virgin beach and the crabs that thrive on it attracting not just the locals, but also tourists from all over the world. One is sure to be mesmerised by the fresh air, the unexploited beach and the panoramic view.









Shantiniketan was a dream of Maharshi Devendranath Tagore that was later on nurtured and practically constructed by his worthy son Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore, the world-famous poet, author, dramatist and artist of 20th century Bengal. The very word "Shantiniketan" means the "the abode of peace".

The tranquil nature and the mesmerizing ambience of the red soil region can be the ultimate destination for those who are looking forward to escape from the city hustles and bustles. Bolpur forms itself with Shantiniketan, Sriniketan and Prantik. The famous Vishva-Bharati University, the open air schools of Shantiniketan created by Tagore and the famous handicraft industries are the most interesting attractions to explore here.

05 Sundarbans 357 km

he Sundarbans mangrove forest, one of the largest such forests in the world (140,000 ha), lies on the delta of the Ganges, Brahmaputra and Meghna rivers on the Bay of Bengal. It is adjacent to the border of India's Sundarbans World Heritage site inscribed in 1987. The site is intersected by a complex network of tidal water ways, mudflats and small islands of salt-tolerant mangrove forests, and presents an excellent example of ongoing ecological processes. The area is known for its wide range of fauna, including 260 bird species, the Bengal tiger and other threatened species such as the estuarine crocodile and the Indian python.

A visit to the Jain temples of Abhapur, dating back to the 15th century, is an immersive experience to have, with the feeling of travelling back in time. With exquisite architecture and remains of the sculptures of apsaras in the premises of the temple, the heritage of Jain architecture is strongly reflected here.

Within massive sandstone outcrops, above comparatively dense forest, are five clusters of natural rock shelters, displaying paintings that appear to date from the Mesolithic Period right through to the historical period. The cultural traditions of the inhabitants of the twenty-one villages adjacent to the site bear a strong resemblance to those represented in the rock paintings.
