Community festivities, with feasts, musical performances, and traditional dances, also grace certain regions.

Sri Lanka honours Ram Navami as Vaikunda Ekadasi, marking it on the eleventh day of the Margazhi month as per the Tamil calendar. This day heralds the commencement of the ten-day Margazhi Utsavam festival. During this joyous period, devotees throng temples to offer prayers to Lord Vishnu and his avatars, including Ram. Vaikunda Ekadasi night is particularly significant, featuring special pujas where devotees engage in nocturnal vigils, offering fervent prayers throughout the night.
